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## Congratulations to Ms. Arfeen Bibi for making it to the Diversity List 2020

It is with great pleasure and honour to share with you that our distinguished alumnus as well as the Head of the English Language Education Committee, Ms. Arfeen Bibi, was recognized on the Diversity List 2020\*—a list of 24 outstanding ethnic minority women in Hong Kong.

Born and raised in Hong Kong, Ms. Arfeen knows firsthand the difficulties and obstacles faced by ethnic minority students, especially women who are expected to fit into traditional customs and stereotypes. To realize her dreams, Ms. Arfeen has overcome countless barriers and obstacles.

Pursuing her doctoral degree in Education at the University of Hong Kong, Ms. Arfeen specializes in exploring the transition ethnic minority students are facing from higher education to work. 'We should be given the chance to demonstrate our capabilities regardless of our outlook or hijab. There should be more calls for inclusiveness when it comes to hiring ethnic minority women at the workplace,' she highlighted.

When asked what she would like to say to ethnic minority students, she made the following remarks, 'Do not conform to the preconceived societal expectations of ethnic minorities or do not even try to fit into one. You are capable. Break the stereotypes. And be bold.'
